	Opportunities for England Athletics to support the Club. Amy Frith, Club Support Manager (Bucks and Northants), EA.	
	Amy opened her presentation introducing herself. Amy has worked for EA for eight years, and since the birth of her child has worked part time 3.5 days per week. The purpose of her visit was to describe how she and EA could help with the growth and development of the Club.	
	Amy then described a number of programmes available:	
1.	 Club Run – Aimed at road running clubs, this programme supports coaches, leaders and members in the Club towards a common goal – eg a number of members working towards a half marathon. EA would put a programme in place involving three progressive sessions. The next wave of applications will be in September. Game Changers – Aimed at young volunteers aged 14-25. Spirit of 2012 – funded by the 2012 legacy charity, this supports clubs to recruit and retain volunteers. Satellite Clubs – Aimed at 11-25 year old age group. Coach and leader development. These two day workshops are aimed at developing movement skills for runners. Description suggests it is about field athletics, but it is more for runners. Physical preparation – builds on movement skills (1 day). LIRF to CIRF workshops. – three hour workshops for those considering undertaking the CIRF course. Can be run in-house even for small numbers. Bespoke club support – eg setting up junior section, nutrition, facility development, mental health campaign, wheelchair racing group, beginner groups, grant applications. Gun to tape course - for new race organisers.

IM has circulated this to the session leaders group for comment, after which it will be amended as necessary.	RM

	IM reflected on the presentation made by Amy and suggested in the long term the Club may consider setting up a junior section. This would depend on demand and on resources, both people and facilities, that the Club would have to provide. It was agreed to ask Amy if she could send us information about what setting up a junior section would entail. RM will contact her.	RM
	IM asked about the 'trophies' for club standards and suggested that a mock-up be put on Facebook so that members could see what they would get. NC will follow up.	NC
	<u>Club Secretary</u>	
	RM reported that EA had asked all club secretaries to check the DBS status of all their coaches and leaders, and that all active leaders in the Club are currently licensed.	
	Treasurer	
	JW stated that the Club remains in a healthy financial state with a balance in the region of £9.5k. Currently need to pay for the storage unit. Many of the Chicken Run commitments have been paid for.	
	Membership Secretary	
	Membership renewals have come in slowly. Some have paid without completing the form, and some have completed the form but not paid yet. NC stated that there were a significant number who have not opened the email. SPYBT will continue to chase outstanding renewals. NC will identify who has not seen the email.	SPYBT NC

	Recent pub socials have been well attended and the Colworth Marathon Challenge seems popular; we don't know for sure how many members have booked places. CF proposed an additional summer social event. It was suggested that tenpin bowling would be different from previous events. Provisional date 14 th July.	CF
